

CAIN AND ABEL THE RABBLE

20 - 30 JULY

CAIN AND ABEL is an electrifying theatrical experience, a provocative and bloody retelling of a story that has stained the earth and our psyche for millennia.

The biblical story of CAIN AND ABEL is the tale of the first act of violence - an act that ricocheted across time. It envisions our history as man on man, brother on brother, blood on the earth. Well beyond its religious beginnings, it is a story that has defined our contemporary understanding of violence. THE RABBLE has reimagined the story as a female one, with two sisters at the centre of the work (MARY HELEN SASSMAN and DANA MILTINS). The sisters recreate the first act of violence over and over again - from biblical sanctity to the spectacle of Hollywood. This is THE RABBLE at their best: a brave, iconoclastic and visually arresting work that questions our core assumptions about femininity and violence.





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HOW TO GET HERE

To get to The SUBSTATION, you can catch the Wiliamstown or Werribee train from Flinders Street Station to Newport Station.

If travelling from another area of Melbourne, change for the Williamstown or Werribee line at North Melbourne. Trains are very regular from North Melbourne towards Newport.

From Newport station, The SUBSTATION in a twominute walk, signposted as you leave Newport train station.

CAR

From the city, head over the West Gate Highway towards Williamstown. There is ample parking in the surrounding Newport and The SUBSTATION area.



BIKE

From Collins Street, go through Docklands towards the Footscray bike path. Head down Whitehall Street and along Somerville Road, and you will get to a shared pedestrian/ bike path towards Hyde Street. From there, you can take Hall Street via Hudson Road or Douglas Parade that will take you to Newport. We advise against Melbourne Road at peak times as it gets very busy.
